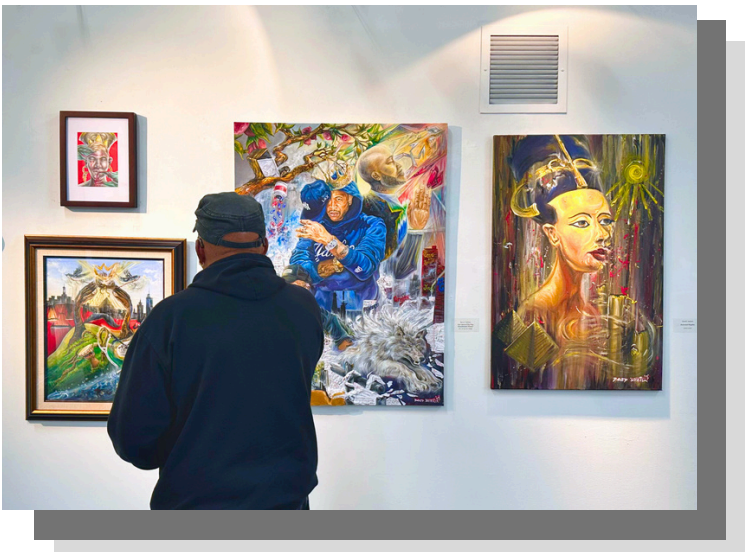

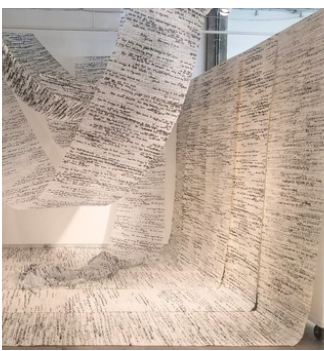
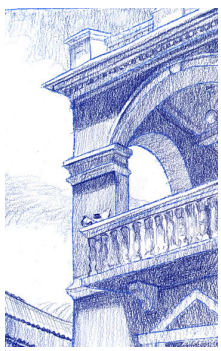


2026 exhibitions at a glance...



JAN – FEB *LIVING INSIDE*

Since 1978, Community Partners in Action's (CPA) Prison Arts Program has worked inside Connecticut prisons to positively and constructively change the lives of the incarcerated and the prison environment by encouraging unique, personal, and evolving artistic pursuits. Prison Art's Permanent Collection brings some of this work out into the world. This exhibition is a window into the world of the prison – into lives lived surrounded by cinder block walls, and the work being done to transcend those walls.



MAR – APR *THE IN-BETWEEN*

Christy Corey, Jasmine Jones, and Diana Abouchacra bring together video, photography, printmaking and illustration in this dynamic exhibition to explore how collaboration influences artistic discourse. The artists often collaborated together in art school, and this exhibition was born from their desire to reconnect after many years. Jasmine's video/ photography work collaborates with poet Brett Maddux, Christy's illustrations are made in conversation with singer/songwriter Ashly LaRosa's haunting lyrics, and Diana's installation and printmaking work combines with the ephemeral poetry written by her sister, Maya Abouchacra.



MAY – JUN *WE ARE MORE*

A showcase of Jackie Decker's extraordinary range of artwork, weaving together themes of creativity, innovation, courage and resilience. From the endearing children's literature illustrations of "Foxtails" to her representational and abstract paintings inspired by her great-grandmother's handmade quilts, this exhibit reminds us of the power of community.



JUL – AUG *12TH ANNUAL MEMBERS' EXHIBIT*

Windsor Art Center's dedicated membership consists of professional and avocational artists of all ages, leading to a dynamic exhibit featuring a vast array of styles, subjects, and media. Awards are given for best in show, second place, honorable mentions, and young participant awards.

SEP – OCT *ART AND INFLUENCE: A MAX COYER RETROSPECTIVE*

Max Coyer was a Windsor artist best known for painting in a style he described as "synthetic art," an amalgamation of academic and modernist movements. Max passed away in 1988 at the age of 34, and this retrospective highlights how the creative process is one layer on top of a deep strata built over the history of art. His own paintings extol the artists that went before him, and we plan to include the work of those that he in turn influenced, the Max Coyer Scholarship recipients.



NOV – DEC *REVERBERATIONS*

Featuring Paola Bari and Jenny Wu, *Reverberations* asks the question "who are we when we push beyond the boundaries of what seems possible?" Playing with the limitations of their mediums, Bari, a porcelain artist, and Wu, a painter, each transform the materials they use to provide new context and invite users to question their own perceptions.
